G.O.O.D. for Girls, Inc. (GfG) is a 501(c)3 nonprofit community-based asset/leadership development and mentoring organization for girls ages 9 – 18. We provide consistent one-to-one and group mentoring to help develop and strengthen positive internal assets, including positive self-esteem/values; social competencies; positive identity; empowerment; constructive use of time; commitment to learning; boundaries and expectations and support. The girls meet the first and third Saturdays of each month for focused interactive learning activities, trips, special events or community service that support their growth. Additional meetings may also be scheduled depending on the activity and/or project. We have openings for the Advisory Board and the Executive Board.

Why Should You Apply?

- Opportunities to seek out activities and events that that will be beneficial to all the stakeholders in our organization – girls, mentors, parents, staff, and board members

The responsibilities of the Advisory Board include:

- to successfully complete an interview to become part of the GfG Team
- to advocate for GfG in as many different streams and venues as possible
- to actively seek out, vet and share information that you feel will help inform and/or support the program in a timely fashion
- to actively participate in the annual Joint Executive/Advisory Board meetings (twice per year)
- to submit the annual personal contribution of \$500
- to commit to a term of two years, renewable every two years.
- to give permission for images of your person to be used by GfG or a 3rd party while participating in the organization. These images may be used in promotions, marketing materials, websites, and in general benefit of the organization.

The responsibilities of the Executive Board include:

- oversees that the mission and vision address a community need
- ensures that operationally, the organization is fulfilling its' mission
- ensures the legal requirements are met
- ensures the public trust is upheld
- ensures that all practices are ethical
- assures the financial integrity and solvency of the organization
- regularly attend Board and committee meetings. (Board meetings are scheduled for Jan, March, May, July, September, and December of each calendar year)
- use your skills to lead and/or join one or more of the Board positions or committees (Board positions include Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. Committees include Program Development, Marketing and Social Media, Assessment, Funding, and Finance/Budget)
- carefully prepare for meetings in advance
- regularly review financial reports and other critical information
- maintain confidentiality of information held by the organization.
- engage in approved fundraising efforts to help support the fiscal solvency of the organization
- uphold and represent the organization at various events and venues
- avoid using the organization's opportunities for personal gain
- act in good faith when making decisions and casting your vote
- submit an annual personal contribution of \$500 to GfG
